
CONFERRING AUTHORITY UPON THE SECRETARY OF STATE WITH REGARD

TO CONTROL OF CERTAIN DIPLOMATIC, CONSULAR, AND OFFICIAL PROPERTY


IN THE UNITED STATES

By virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution, the Trading with the Enemy Act, as amended (50 U.S.C. App. 1 et seq.) and other statutes of the United States and as President of the United States and Commander-in-Chief, it is hereby ordered as follows:

- 1. The Secretary of State is authorized and empowered as he deems necessary in the national interest to take custody of, direct, manage, supervise and control all property and interests within the United States owned or controlled by the embassies, legations, consulates or other official establishments in the United States of the Government of ___, including all assets on the premises of such property, and the property and interests within the United States owned or controlled by any of the diplomatic, consular or other official personnel of such establishments in the United States and by any persons within the classes described in paragraph (15) (C) (G), and (I) of Section 101 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8U.S.C. 1101).
- 2. The Office of Alien Property shall not exercise any authority conferred upon it by any other Executive Order with respect to the property and interests referred to in paragraph 1 of this Order over shich the Secretary of State is exercising authority, except so far as the Secretary of State releases his authority over such property and interests. The Secretary of State shall notify the Office of Alien Property in writing of such property or interests.
- 3. When the Secretary of State determines to exercise any authority conferred upon him by this order with respect to any property over which the Secretary of the Treasury shall release all authority over such property, except as permitted by the Secretary of State.
- 4. The Secretary of State is authorized to prescribe such regulations, rulings and instructions, as he may find desirable to carry out the purposes of this order.
- 5. The Secretary of State may delegate the authority conferred on him by this Order to any officer or employee under his supervision and he may call upon other agencies of the Executive Branch of the Government to assist in carrying out the purposes of this Order. Such assistance shall be provided subject to such terms as may be agreed upon by the Secretary of State and the head of the requested agency.
- 6. Until such time as requests may be presented to and approved by the congresency funds available to the President may be allotted to defray the expense of operations herein authorized.
 - 7. This Order supersedes all conflicting provisions of Executive Order

PROCLAIMING THAT THE NATIONAL DEFENSE REQUIRES IMMEDIATE ACTIONS FOR MILITARY PURPOSE WITH RESPECT TO COMMUNICATIONS, PLANT SECURITY, AND VESSEL SECURITY

BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the national defense requires immediate actions for military purposes with respect to communications, plant security, and vessel security, in order to repel enemy attack upon the United States;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, the United States, do hereby order:: , President of

- 1. Notwithstanding the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, any carrier may permit the interception, receipt or use of any communication by wire or radio of or to any foreign government, whether or not recognized by the United States, by representatives of the military departments or the Department of Justice.
- 2. The Secretary of Defense or his designees are authorized to take such action as he deems necessary to summarily bar from access to any defense facility, individuals whom there is reasonable ground to believe may engage in sabotage, espionage, or other subversive acts.
- 3. Notwithstanding any provision of law, no person shall be employed or permitted to serve as radio operator aboard any vessel (other than a vessel of foreign registry) if the Secretary of Defense or his designees (1) has disapproved such employment or service for any specified voyage, route or area of operation, and (2) has notified the Master of the vessel of such disapproval. No vessel shall be granted clearance, depart or attempt to depart from any port or place in the United States, its territories or possessions, or the Canal Zone, while having on board a person employed or serving as radio operator, in violation of the foregoing disapproval of the Secretary of Defense or his designees.

PERSONNEL THTO PROTECTIVE CUSTODY IN THE EVENT OF AN ALL-OUT NUCLEAR ATTACK ON THE

Dear Mr. Secretary:

In the event of an all-out nuclear attack on the United States, you are hereby directed to take immediately the following action:

- 1. With respect to surviving enemy official personnel who are representatives to international organizations and members of their staffs or officials of international organizations, together with their families you are directed to initiate and maintain measures of protection, surveillance, and control which will afford personal protection to the individuals and, pursuant to U.S. obligations under relevant international agreements, permit performance by them of their official functions to the maximum extent consistent with the U.S. right to safeguard its own security.
- 2. With respect to all other surviving diplomatic, consular, and other official personnel and foreign press representatives of such countries you are directed to take into protective custody such persons, members of their immediate families and their attendants, employees, and servants who have a nonimmigrant status.

You are authorized to call upon any federal agency to assist you in carrying out these responsibilities and such agency is directed to utilize its available personnel, equipment, supplies, facilities and resources as you may direct, consistent with its own primary mission.

I expect, of course, that all such persons will be accorded decent and humane treatment in keeping with the honor and dignity of the United States of America and in accordance with generally accepted principles of internationa law and practice.

Pending conclusion of agreements for the exchange of persons, you are authorized and empowered to enter into such agreements and arrangements with third countries to act as protecting powers as you may deem appropriate and necessary.
